UPDATES

CERB extended by eight (8) weeks

The Canada Emergency Response Benefit (CERB) has been **extended from 16 weeks to 24 weeks** for workers who:

- · stopped working due to COVID-19, or
- are eligible for Employment Insurance regular or sickness benefits, or
- have exhausted their Employment Insurance regular benefits or Employment Insurance fishing benefits between December 29, 2019 and October 3, 2020.



CESB available for recent high school graduates

The Canada Emergency Student Benefit (CESB) provides temporary income support to post-secondary students and recent post-secondary and high school graduates who are facing a different job market this summer due to COVID-19. With this benefit, students could get \$1,250 per month for up to four months. Eligible students with disabilities or those with children or other dependents can receive \$2,000.

Applications for the third period of the CESB opened on **July 6, 2020**.

If you recently graduated high school and are enrolled in a post-secondary educational program that starts before February 1, 2021, you may be eligible to start applying for the CESB. To be eligible for the CESB, you must be actively looking for work.

Eligible high school graduates who graduated after June 7, 2020, can apply for period 3 and period 4 of the CESB inclusively. Applications will be accepted until September 30, 2020.

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HOW TO APPLY:

- **Step 1:** Create a profile with the CRA by calling 1-800-959-8281 to register your SIN (for students who have never filed a tax return). If this doesn't apply to you, go to step 2!
- Step 2: Register for CRA's My Account, as it is the fastest and easiest way to complete your CESB application.
 - Note: you don't need to wait for your My Account security code to apply for the CESB.
- **Step 3:** Sign up for **Direct Deposit** to have CESB payments deposited directly into your bank account. Financial institutions across the country are also allowing Canadians to sign up for CRA direct deposit through their bank portals in a few easy steps.

Extension of Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy

As part of his July 13 update, Prime Minister Justin Trudeau said that the Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy (CEWS) will be extended until December "to give greater certainty and support to businesses as we restart the economy." We will share details when they become available.

Gradual reopening of Service Canada centres

The Government of Canada is working to gradually reopen Service Canada Centres to help serve most Canadians living within 100 km of a Centre, and to support those who face barriers to accessing eServices. Our priority is the health and safety of all Canadians and our staff, while maintaining service to the public. You can still access most of Service Canada's programs and services from the comfort of your own home. SIN, EI/CERB, CPP and OAS can all be applied to online. If you do need to visit a Service Canada centre in person, please make a request for an appointment by filling out their service request form.

Emergency Funding for COVID-19 Safety Measures in Forest Operations

On July 10, Minister of Natural Resources Canada, Seamus O'Regan, announced the federal government's intent to provide up to \$30 million to offset additional costs associated with COVID-19 safety measures for small and medium enterprises in the forest sector, including tree-planting operations. Canada intends to work with the provinces and territories to deliver this funding, which will preserve jobs for forest sector workers, including approximately 7,000 tree planters this year.

More specifically, the investment will help cover extra costs for things like sanitizing stations, additional accommodations and/or transportation, facilities and services to maintain social distancing, and personal protective equipment. In addition, the funding will help support the scheduled planting of 600 million trees.
